2nd QUARTER

1. Tim Travis has been placed as a reserve officer and will begin regular training sessions for us. Tim retired from Round Rock PD as Lieutenant and a Training Officer with them. He has already taught some very good classes to Officers with Early and surrounding agencies.
2. Officer Taylor Fletcher was involved in a traffic collision on March 26th while running an emergency call with lights and siren. He was responding to a house fire. Officer Fletcher entered an intersection against a red light. Video confirms he slowed down but he didn't see a vehicle coming from behind a pickup and trailer. There were no injuries. The car is out of service and awaiting repair. The accident has gone before a review board and was ruled that the cause of the crash was with Officer Fletcher. Officer Fletcher will receive a letter of Reprimand for the incident. Additional Emergency Driving training has begun with all officers.
3. 1 Officer complaint was filed for use of force. This was presented to the review Board. The board found no policy violation and cleared the officer of any wrong doing.
4. Officers assisted BCSO and Fire units in evacuations and road blocking during the wildfires.
5. New radio system continues to prove itself valuable. Minor bugs still being tweaked but all is good.
