CODE ENFORCEMENT

In the first quarter we had 23 new cases opened. Of those cases we were able to get 13 properties to come into compliance. At this time we have 27 total open cases.


The past year we have been working closely with upper management and public works on the Unified Development Code. We have been reviewing and making thoughtful discussions on the present and future of Early. We have thought about the present businesses, home owners, and property owners as well as the future development we believe the city is headed.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS

The building inspections and permit department had a great quarter. We issued 37 new permits. Within those permits were 6 accessory, 3 commercial (including new buildings and remodels), 2 new houses, 24 trade permits (plumbing, electrical, and mechanical) and 2 occupancy permits.



With these new permits there was about 127 inspections done. Out of the new permits listed we have 7 permits still on going. Included with the 30 permits we closed this quarter we were able to inspect and close a total of 51 permits this quarter.

It has been the goal of the building department to go through all the plans and maps that the city has on file and to put those plans into a digital format. Out of about 422 plans we are about 51% complete. With hopes to finish the scanning by mid-year of 2021.
